## My Best Three (Writing)

- + > Clear focus maintained throughout
  - Effectively establishes setting, narrator and/or characters, and point of view
  - > Logical sequence of events from beginning to end
  - > Effective opening and closing for audience & purpose
  - > Effective use of a variety of narrative techniques that advance the story or illustrate the experience (i.e. elaboration, description, dialogue)
  - Effective and detailed analysis of the historical significance of a place or time
- ✓ > Clear focus generally maintained throughout
  - > Adequately establishes setting, narrator and/or characters, and point of view
  - > Adequate sequence of events from beginning to end
  - > Adequate opening and closing for audience & purpose
  - > Adequate use of a variety of narrative techniques that advance the story or illustrate the experience (i.e. elaboration, description, dialogue).
  - > Adequately analyzes the historical significance of a place or time
- $\sqrt{-}$  > Inconsistent focus throughout
  - Inconsistently establishes setting, narrator and/or characters, and point of view
  - > Uneven sequence of events from beginning to end
  - > Opening and Closing, if present, are weak
  - > Narrative techniques, if present, are inconsistent
    - > May not give an adequate description of historical significance of a place or time
  - > Provides little or no focus; focus may be confusing or vague
    - > May be very brief
    - Difficult to follow sequence of events; may include extraneous ideas or events
    - > Use of narrative techniques is minimal, absent, in error, or irrelevant
    - > Does not provide an adequate description of historical significance of a place or time; may be absent entirely

NTY > Is grossly incomplete

> Provides NO EVIDENCE of narrative structure (storytelling, details, etc.)

	>	Adequate use of sensory, concrete, and figurative language which generally advance the purpose of the writing
	>	Adequate use of punctuation, capitalization, and spelling
	>	Some errors in usage and sentence formation, but no systematic pattern of errors is displayed; errors generally do not interfere with understanding
√-	>	Inconsistent use of basic transitional devices: words and phrases, paragraphing, and overall sentence structure
	>	Partial or weak use of sensory, concrete, and figurative language that may not advance the purpose of the writing
	>	Inconsistent use of punctuation, capitalization, and spelling
	>	Frequent errors in usage may obscure meaning
-	>	Few or no transitional strategies are evident
	>	Uses limited language
	>	Errors are frequent and severe and meaning is often obscured
NTY	>	Work shows NO EVIDENCE of editing or revision
	>	Work is grossly incomplete with several errors that make understanding difficult
